My friend Rob has gone, he was one of the people that I turned to for advice when I first joined Birmingham Canoe Club in 1970. He was always one of the river leaders on tours and as a keen newcomer I often drew on his freely given coaching and river leading skills until I developed my own. He was the man that showed me most of the rivers I paddled early in my career. With an appetite for white water I soon developed my own friends and paddling group within the club but Rob was always there to help, my first canoe polo boat was the Wombat (designed by Rob) my second polo boat was an improved Wombat 2 (part designed by me). He was there in 1985 along with John Heath to test me for my Advanced Proficiency (now 5 star) and subsequently persuaded me to join the coach course he ran later that year whereupon I became a Senior Instructor. Once I passed my assessment we colluded on many coaching courses teaching many Birmingham school teachers the skills needed to take children out on the water. It was when we shared a car over to Northfield to go to BCC baths session we talked about a club for Sutton as we were getting fed up of travelling well over 30 miles to go to the baths. So in 1990 we put our heads together and saw the potential for a club based in Sutton and brought people and venues together and so began Sutton club. That was 21 years ago and we have been proud to have been instrumental in making the club the success it is today.

I know this piece talks about me a lot but I hope that you can see through this to see why I will miss him so much. He had his faults as do we all but his commitment to the sport was complete and unfaltering. It is now up to me to take on the future and I hope with the help of the fantastic committee we now have we can do without him, but never forget him.

ROBERT BRUCE LEADLEY 1942 to 2010

Rob was born in 1942 to Win & Arthur Leadley, an only child. He said he could remember V.E. celebrations at the end of the second world war. He attended King Edward's Aston, Grammar School & then went to St Peter's College, Saltley, where he gained a teaching Certificate in Education specialising in handicraft (woodwork) & maths.

Rob joined the staff at Blessed John Wall School (now St John Wall), Handsworth, where he taught full time for 34 years. Later he worked there part time, still doing some teaching & assisting the caretaker & staff.

Whilst at the school, together with Mike Baines & others he ran the school canoe club. They made their own canoes out of fibreglass, more than 300 being made altogether. There were many school camps with outdoor activities, usually canoeing & walking. The boys took part in some canoe slalom events with one boy later reaching the World Championships. Another later took part in an expedition to the Himalayas. Others simply enjoyed the sport, recognising it's value in giving excitement & refreshment to their young lives.

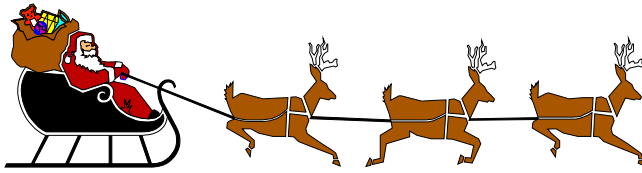
Rob himself won a few medals & his achievements particularly in coaching were recognised by receiving the Canoe England Award.

It was as Treasurer of Birmingham Canoe Club that Rob met Terry & they married in 1970. They are blessed with three children, Jeni, Andy & Jon together with delightful partners Christian, Helen & Rachel. They have four lovely granddaughters.

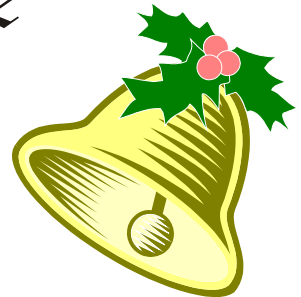
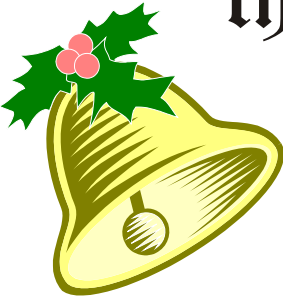
Rob was one of the founder members of Royal Sutton Coldfield Canoe Club. He was also interested in stamp collecting, cycling, walking & gardening. In his later years, he & Terry took up narrow boating, with son Jon taking a keen interest.

Rob died of a heart attack whilst asleep. At his request his ashes will be scattered in the river Vrynwy above Dolanog Falls.

Rob did believe in God & had a hope of eternal life. He will be sadly missed by family and friends.

River Tame and Coventry Canal Tour - 12th September

15 paddlers met on the sunny morning in question at Peel's Wharf at the appointed time. Ferry was arranged (thanks Rich) and we set off along the canal in fine spirits led by Pete and Tim. I paddled with Barb for a bit and admired her new red Dagger Blackwater. It looked very clean and shiny.

This paddle was part of the current 2 star course, though some of us were just along for the ride!

The first real excitement of the day was leaving the canal and joining The Tame. This involved seal launching from the bank, a reasonably long slope and a bit difficult for first timers. Tim supervised and we all managed successful launches. I did notice the new dagger was looking a bit grubbier now. Pete and Tim were last on the bank and then announced that they didn't fancy launching from there and set off down river to find an easier access!

We continued down on moving water, paddling through Tamworth and getting a whole different view of the A5 and the Snowdome. Next excitement of the day was the low weir just past Ladybridge. The weir had a tree caught against it but still with enough room to pass safely. Pete went first and set himself up as official photographer to catch the action. First group went over easily enough but Graham got a bit sideways. I rescued his boot (I do mean BOOT and not boat!) as it floated past, Graham rescued himself! Matt also took a swim here; I missed that but heard the splash.

We retired to the bank and Tim and Pete talked about the features and dangers of weirs. Another Seal launch was in order now. This time a bit higher and more of a drop - all good experience for the 2 starrers! All went well. I thought Alice's was particularly graceful. Then came Barb's turn. Oops! - Never mind, undaunted but a little wetter she tried again from a different part of the bank. Same result! Barbs remained determinedly cheerful though, and in fairness I don't think the keel of her boat helped much. Incidentally the boat was definitely muddy now and had lost its 'just out of the box' look.

We paddled the flood relief channel towards paper mill weir. It was a bit clogged up with weeds and not as pleasant as it could have been - a lot of litter too - a real shame.

Paper mill weir looks scarier than it is. Pete and I went first, Pete this time armed with his 'helmet cam.' We will have to check out Facebook for the results! Everyone shot through in fine style with no dramas. Great fun! Most of us clambered back up for a second go. The only casualty here was Simon who got it a bit wrong while playing in the white water at the bottom

We meandered the next part of the river spotting heron and kingfishers. The portage through Hopwas Woods back to the canal is always a test of fitness! Poor Rich made a bit of a mess of his launch back into the canal, but unfortunately made a worse mess of his shins when he climbed out, scraping them painfully across the concrete under hang which was hidden under the water. I was relieved to see him the next night at Blackroot not too much the worse for his mishap.

We paddled the last section of canal back to The Tame Otter. Barbs had dried out. Then she fell in again! By now the boat looked as though she had been paddling it for the last 10 years!

A very enjoyable mornings paddling, nice weather and great company. Thanks to Tim, Pete, Rich, Alison, George, Liam, Megan, Graham, Barb, Hannah, Matt, Simon, James and Alice.

CHASEWATER RESERVOIR update

To say they have their feet in the mud is the right pun to describe the progress over the repairs to the dam. At this time Litchfield Council who own the dam have only just appointed Galliford Try as the main contractors for the job and work will only start at the beginning of December. This is a full year after they began to empty the lake. The lake is now below "valve" level and so no more water will be coming from the lake. They estimate that work should be finished by the end of March and then they can start refilling the lake

BUT!!!!

The streams that flow into the lake are small and few in number and British Waterways Hydrologists think that even if we get a lot of exceptionally wet weather over the next 2 years it will only be back to normal by the end of 2013 and if it turns out normal it could take 10 years to attain it's full level.

This will affect the canal at Rushall for far longer than we expected but as BW have started to padlock the lock paddles overnight and keep Bradley pumps working 24/7 the level so far has not been too bad, they even have plans to pump from the Tame at Great Bridge if they get desperate.
